Another recent event was the National Legislative Conference in Washington, DC. Brett Kaltvedt and Kristie Brunick traveled to our capital to represent the SDAPHCC and advocate for industry friendly policies. Here are a few notes from the event:

More than 100 PHCC members, chapter leaders, and industry stakeholders gathered in the nation's capital from May 20–21 to champion key issues affecting the plumbing, heating, and cooling industry. Attendees met with lawmakers to support federal workforce development programs, defend natural gas as a vital part of the U.S. energy mix, promote consumer choice, and advocate for pro-growth tax policies.

In a well-timed development, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R.1—the "Big Beautiful Bill"—on the morning after the conference. The legislation includes several PHCC-supported tax measures, including:

- A permanent extension of the Section 199A pass-through income deduction
- Maintenance of higher estate tax exemption thresholds
- An extension of bonus depreciation with full expensing beyond 2026

"These legislative wins are a reminder of the power of grassroots advocacy and the strong presence PHCC can bring to Capitol Hill," said Mark Valentini, PHCC Vice President of Legislative Affairs. "Our unified voice is helping to shape policies that will reduce contractors' tax burdens and empower them to reinvest in their businesses and workforce."



PHCC Comes to Washington, House Votes on Budget Reconciliation Package with Wins for Contractors!

PHCC closed out its 2025 Legislative Conference with great success. Over 100 contractors, chapter executives and industry representatives came to Washington, DC to advocate for robust federal workforce programs, the central role of natural gas in our national energy portfolio and consumer choice, and tax policies that strengthen American businesses and promote economic growth.

The conference began Tuesday, May 20 with an early morning breakout hosting chapter executives and officers for a review of federal policies and state-level legislative trends. The morning continued with a first-timers briefing with more than 20 newcomers to the annual advocacy event. After a briefing with PHCC's Government Relations Committee, conference attendees enjoyed a lunch where long-time PHCC member Butch McGonegal was recognized by PHCC of Virginia for his decades of service to our association and industry. Keynote speaker and former Congressman Tom Davis provided an insightful presentation on the current political climate in Washington, followed by the "Chuck and Mark Show" issues briefing and panel discussion with top industry lobbyists on the state of tax reform. Attendees were treated to an evening reception on Capitol Hill alongside our allies from Air-conditioning Heating and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI) and Heating Air-conditioning Refrigeration Distributors International (HARDI).

Rainy weather the following day did not impede our agenda as contractors trudged to Capitol Hill to meet with their legislators, exercising their quintessential First Amendment right to petition their government. The conference closed out with a reception where we welcomed special guest and second-generation PHCC contractor Rep. Mark Messmer (R-IN) to join us for a break from the legislative chaos of the past several months.

The timing of PHCC's presence could not have been better. On Thursday morning May 22 as PHCC members were waking up and preparing to travel home, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R.1, the "Big Beautiful Bill" encompassing the top policy priorities of the new Republican administration which includes tax provisions on which we advocated. PHCC members helped secure language that makes the Section 199A pass-through income

deduction permanent, maintains higher estate tax thresholds, and extends bonus depreciation past 2026 with full expensing. The bill now goes to the Senate, where PHCC will continue to advocate for these important tax provisions that will benefit all contractors by mitigating their tax burdens while allowing cost savings that will be invested back into their businesses and the U.S. economy.



2025 Online Plumbing Continuing Ed Course Now Available, Plus Additional Virtual Class

A Wake-up Call: Addressing Mental Health in Construction

The construction industry faces a staggering challenge: it has one of the highest suicide rates among all professions, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). In today's climate of stress, fear, and uncertainty, this harsh reality underscores the urgent need to address mental health on the jobsite.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, an important time for you as plumbing and HVAC business owners to reflect on how you manage mental health issues within your teams ... and within yourselves.

Supporting Mental Health in Your Workforce

As a leader, maintaining a positive team culture is key. Empathy, open communication, and awareness of employees' mental health challenges are crucial to fostering a supportive workplace. Start by recognizing the signs of stress or burnout, including:

- Changes in mood.
- Decreased productivity
- Withdrawal from social interactions.



Create opportunities for team members to discuss their well-being openly and ensure they feel heard and supported. One effective approach is to regularly check in with your employees. Simple questions like "How are you feeling today?" or "Is there anything I can support you with?" can open the door to meaningful conversations. Additionally, consider incorporating mental health resources, such as Employee Assistance Programs (EAPs), which offer confidential counseling and support services.

Practicing Grace Under Pressure

Leaders who practice grace under pressure "improve employee well-being and trust." In this <u>SmartBrief article</u>, Julie Winkle Giulioni suggests six practices toward cultivating an environment where people can collaborate and do their best work:

- 1. **Make space for humanity.** Leaders who acknowledge emotions without letting them derail progress build trust and long-term results.
- 2. **Assume positive intent.** Trust that people act in good faith, even when outcomes fall short, and approach conversations with curiosity.

- 3. **Respond rather than react.** Practice emotional discipline, pausing before responding to maintain clarity and compassion.
- 4. **Honor multiple realities.** Instead of forcing alignment, value diverse perspectives and seek shared respect, not uniformity.
- 5. Offer "soft landings" for hard truths. Deliver candid feedback respectfully, focusing on growth rather than blame.
- **6. Hold people capable, not just accountable.** Focus on development, fostering potential while maintaining high expectations.

Taking Care of Yourself

Running a plumbing or HVAC business can be stressful, especially when balancing leadership responsibilities with the needs of your team. To manage your own mental health, it's essential to make self-care a priority. During our visits we had productive conversations on the following items:

 Taxes – Extend tax provisions that maintain or increase estate tax thresholds, preserve the 199A deduction for qualified business income, and support a reduction of the corporate tax rate to 15%
